Starting School

YCIS is ready to welcome you. The school will be in contact with details for arrangement of school services and let parents know about the first day.







We celebrate the individual child. The highly experienced teaching staff at the YCIS interviews will not be looking for a "product" of a prep-academy. The best advice, prior to our interview, is to stay relaxed, enjoy a family breakfast after a good night's sleep, as your child will sense any unnecessary nervousness. Chat easily with your child and encourage them to open up their thinking and communication with both children and adults. The partnership between home and school is very important and YCIS seeks families who believe in the same education philosophy.

YCIS Co-Principals seek children displaying the potential to embrace the school's all-round curriculum. Year level placement is based on several factors including academic performance, English language proficiency, all-round skills, social development, prior records, date of birth, and learning needs.

Early Childhood Education (ECE) - Ages 6 months to 4 Years Old

We invite families to an ECE family interview if a suitable place is available. Parents, together with their child, meet with an academic leadership representative who will discuss the on-going development of the child with their parents, as well as the parents' own views and philosophies regarding their child's education. The child's language and general development, as well as their overall suitability are considered. Parents must attend the mandatory Early Childhood Education Information Session, or equivalent private tour, prior to receiving an interview invitation.

Lower Primary - Ages 5 to 7 Years Old

Children join a small group set-up and they handle a range of activities where teaching staff assess all-round skills and understanding. Areas of proficiencies such as thinking / creativity / social / language development are all carefully evaluated. English and Chinese (if a background of learning Chinese)





Secondary - Ages 11 to 17 Years Old

Applicants for the Secondary will be invited to take an online English assessment; this gives clear indications to the student's learning progress and potential. If there is a Chinese study background then a written assessment is given to gauge the appropriate level. If an applicant is successful at this stage, then they will be invited to an interview with senior academic staff members. Students must be able to display the potential to thrive in the YCIS learning environment and access the full curriculum without the need for services beyond our Learning Support Programme.









Questions Asked By Parents

1. Why Choose YCIS?

The school has developed an innovative and unique curriculum to help young people adapt to the ever-changing world and teach our next generation to be fully equipped for the challenges ahead. YCIS provides through-train education for children aged 6 months to 18 years of age with entry to most year levels being possible. YCIS's international education is one that opens minds to the realities of the world at large and awakens in students the belief of justice, equity and respect for all mankind with a strong awareness of responsibility.

YCIS's global education promotes positive values thereby actively encouraging students to take responsibility for their actions and to see themselves as global citizens who can contribute to a more peaceful, just, and sustainable world. Within a bilingual learning environment all students have the potential to become proficient in the world's two prominent languages, English and Chinese. Combined with the YCIS holistic, inquiry-based style, students naturally immerse themselves on a life-long journey.

2. What is the YCIS curriculum?

The YCIS international curriculum is strategically developed through research and expertise. Overarching learning outcomes are set to meet our educational philosophy. Our ECE experts have developed the early years' unique programme, which promotes curiosity and boundless all-round development. YCIS follows the framework and learning objectives of the National Curriculum for England (NCE) in Primary and Lower Secondary. Students are prepared for commencing the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) programme from the Cambridge International Examinations (CIE), and thereafter, to succeed in achieving the International Baccalaureate Diploma (IB).



3. How does YCIS give their students the edge?

A YCIS student naturally becomes absorbed in the specially created multi-cultural and bilingual learning environment. The school is committed to an approach that offers a unique richness and diversity of both Eastern and Western cultures; this equips children to be truly bilingual, competitive, and global-minded world citizens who respect both cultures. Bilingual education is not simply about learning languages, but also focuses on helping students to immerse in Eastern and Western cultures, which in turn promotes flexible and appreciative thinking.

Parents widely seek to equip their children to get the best head start in life; global education is as much about developing skills and it is about gaining knowledge. Triggering great interest and multiple offers from the world's top universities, YCIS students are recognised for their notable achievements in education as well as their advanced levels of character and holistic education.



4. What makes YCIS bilingual education different from other schools?

The YCIS bilingual learning environment goes beyond the classroom too. A unique and pioneering role-model arrangement, through Co-teaching and Co-Principal leadership, gives emphasis to the equal value of English and Chinese education. The embracement of Co-teaching will differ by age level and section of school. In ECE classes the children have equal absorption of English and Chinese (at this stage it is predominantly Cantonese for the Chinese component). As children progress to Primary then the delivery is more towards 75% English and 25% Chinese (Mandarin). In the Secondary school the English increases to assist students in advancement to IGCSE and IB Diploma. All Secondary students must study Chinese. This ensures a balance between success in external international examinations and proficiency in the two world languages and cultures throughout the school setting.

5. How much emphasis does YCIS put on music?

Music will feature frequently throughout all classes and formally YCIS launches music instruction as early as age four, in Early Childhood Education. This comes with the learning of violin, which increases the left-side brain development at an age when this is critical. There is a significant relationship between honing musical listening skills and language tone advancement. The left side of the brain enhances a child's spatial-temporal reasoning skills, which can also promote mathematical dexterity and memory span.


YCIS operates a highly successful In-school Individual Instrumental Programme (IIIP) whereby a student from Year 1 to Year 13 may partake. The arrangement is very convenient, within school hours and private rooms being available, plus all the music tutors are screened and approved by our Fellows-in Residence Division. This is an excellent programme designed to help the all-round child development that is at the heart of YCIS philosophy.

6. How will YCIS prepare my child for life after graduation?

Firstly it should be noted that the success of the student does not stop with a graduation result gained at 18 years old, this is just the beginning of the rest of their life. The selection of course and choice of appropriate university to kick-start their career is very important. YCIS has a professional and highly experienced team of University Guidance Counsellors (UGO). They offer career planning guidance and assistance with IB course selection as students are prepared to attend a university and follow an appropriate programme in their chosen field and country. The Counsellors offer one-to-one university planning support, assist students in compiling the necessary materials required for university and college applications whilst helping to prepare transcripts and reference letters for students. The Counsellors' expertise allows them to help keep students and parents informed about the requirements for tertiary studies, the courses and programmes offered in various countries, and the application processes.


